

The state of Amapá borders the French Guiana, Suriname and the Atlantic Ocean. Amapá is part of the Amazon forest and 72% of the state is reserved for areas of environmental preservation. This state has about 49 different indigenous ethnic groups, besides quilombo communities (Brazilian hinterland settlement founded by people of African origin including the Quilombolas, the descendants of escaped slaves).
